Columbia College Loss of CCPG and Enrollment Priority

SB 1456 establishes the Student Success Act of 2012 and requires any college or district receiving funds to provide support services including orientation, assessment, counseling and education planning. Students qualifying for a fee waiver are required to identify, upon enrollment, a degree, certificate, or transfer goal and meet Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP).

Loss of Enrollment Priority

Students with over 100 degree applicable units or 2 consecutive semesters of not meeting academic and/or progress standards will lose priority registration

Not meeting academic standards means having less than a 2.0 GPA

Not meeting progress standards means completing less than 50% of your units

Loss of eligibility will become effective at the first registration opportunity after **any** of these standards have not been met

Loss of CCPG

Students with **2 consecutive semesters** of not meeting academic and/or progress standards will lose the CCPG

Not meeting academic standards means having less than a 2.0 GPA Not meeting progress standards means completing less than 50% of your units

Loss of eligibility will become effective at the first registration opportunity after any of these standards have not been met
